• COVID-19 Outreach Rapid Response Team (CORRT)

- Toronto Public Health has extended the COVID-19 Outreach Rapid Response
 Team (CORRT) until April 29, 2022.
- Staffed by Public Health Nurses, CORRT delivers COVID-19 vaccine information sessions to groups of residents or workers in Toronto who have not yet been fully vaccinated and/or received a booster dose, particularly in neighborhoods and populations with lower vaccine coverage rates.
- Sessions are delivered to residents and staff at community agencies, workplaces, as well as other organizations in Toronto.

- This webinar series, specifically targeted at Black and racialized communities across Ontario will provide information on COVID-19 vaccines for individuals involved in educating communities on the efficacy and safety of the COVID-19 vaccines. Through a series of talks, educators will be equipped with essential information on vaccine facts and myth-busters. Educators will be able to share information in a culturally-responsive manner, to vaccine-hesitant communities ensuring that persons within these communities deciding on COVID-19 vaccination, do so based on correct information.
- The STEP Speaker Series organized by SickKids is series of presentations that will be delivered by various experts. The programme is being run in collaboration with the SickKids Learning Institute, the Black Creek Community Health Centre, the Scarborough Health Network VaxFacts and the Black Physicians' Association of Ontario (BPAO).

- Appointments are available for 4th doses <u>COVID-19 Vaccination Appointment</u> booking page
- Walk-ins are welcome (try booking appointments to avoid long waiting times in cold weather)
- The clinic is open to anyone
- People with no immigration status are welcome at our clinic.
- People with no fixed address are welcome at our clinic.
- People with no identification are welcome at our clinic. But if you do have an OHIP card or other identification, please bring it with you as it will help with the registration process.
- Receiving vaccines for someone else is considered fraud.
- The clinic is fully wheelchair accessible.
- Our clinic is multilingual, and privacy stations are available.
- You are welcome to bring up to 1 support person with you, if required.
- First, second, third and fourth doses (Appointments are strongly recommended to minimize wait times outside in cold)
- Please let us know if you require any additional accommodations.
